What is HOPE?

Positive experiences help all children thrive. HOPE (Healthy Outcomes from Positive Experiences) identifies ways that health care providers help ensure that all children have access to positive experiences and all families have support to nurture and celebrate their strengths. HOPE aims to fundamentally transform how we advance health and well-being for our children, families, and communities.

The Details:

Join us for this 2-part interactive virtual training on spreading HOPE in health care. We'll review the science behind Positive Childhood Experiences (PCEs), how PCEs mitigate Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), and the Four Building Blocks of HOPE. As a group, we will discuss HOPEful ways to screen for ACEs in the health care setting and options for learning about your patients' PCEs as well. Come prepared to engage! We will be spending time discussing barriers and facilitators to HOPE implementations in your practice. Each participant will leave the session with a 30-day goal for HOPEful health care practice and a clear sense of how they can promote Positive Childhood Experiences for the children they support.
